According to her the true test of leadership is not in rhetoric but in action. While some administrations have made commendable strides in infrastructure, economic reforms, and security, the overall impact on citizens remains uneven.

"Leadership must be measured not by the number of policies announced but by the tangible impact on the lives of citizens. Are people she advises. feeling safer? Are jobs being created? Are social services improving? These are the real indicators of whether the people's mandate is being fulfilled," she argues. She also highlights the role of citizens in governance. He stresses that beyond elections, people must actively engage in the political process, hold leaders accountable, and demand transparency.

"Democracy does not end at the ballot box. A passive electorate allows inefficiency to thrive. Citizens must question policies, track progress, and use democratic mechanisms to ensure leaders remain answerable,"

Ultimately, she asserts that while some leaders are striving to deliver, the gap between promise and performance remains significant. Bridging this gap requires strong political will, institutional reforms, and an electorate that refuses to be sidelined in governance.

"The people's mandate is sacred. Until leaders see it as a duty rather than an entitlement, and until citizens actively defend their rights, democracy will remain fragile,"he concludes.

The question of whether leaders are truly delivering on the people's mandate remains a matter of percep-

tion and reality. While some leaders are making efforts to fulfill their promises, others continue to disappoint the electorate. The future of governance depends on both effective leadership and active civic engagement. Only when leaders prioritize the people's interests over political gains can democracytrulythrive.

As the next electoral cvcles approach, voters must reflect on the past, assess present realities, and make informed choices that will shape a future where leadership truly delivers on the people's mandate.

The defendant pleaded not guilty to the charge when it was read to him, prompting the stage for trial. In the course of the trial, counsel to the prosecution, Mukhtar Ali Ahmed and Faruku Muhammad presented three witnesses and tendered several exhibits.

Why Tinubu Will Have No Rival In Niger Delta In 2027 - Youth Ccalition

"Look at the robust engagements with all stakeholders..., and it is not just engagement like a tea party affair, all the ideas and resolutions brought in by stakeholders are what the NDDC is using to work, and so the people now have a say on how they want their areas to be developed – these are the things endearing people to this Tinubu's government.

"Don't forget, people were thinking the NDDC would be run based on political party affiliation - where it is just a party thing and only members of the APC will benefit, but Ogbuku is carrying everybody along irrespective of their political parties.

"Look at their relationship with the state governors, even those who are not members of the APC, it is very robust, and everyone can see the healthy engagement that they have. You can see the humility of the current leaders of the commission.

Court Grants EFCC`s Move to Amend Charges Against Agunloye Over The \$6b Fraud Allegations

J u s t i c e J u d e Onwuegbuzie of the Federal High Court, FCT sitting in Apo, Abuja on Thursday, January 23, 2025 granted the prayers of the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, EFCC to amend charges brought against a former Minister of Power, Olu Agunloye and make him take his plea.

Agunloye is standing trial by the EFCC on seven-count charges, bordering on official corruption and fraudulent award of Mambilla Power Project contract to the tune of \$6billion (Six Billion United States Dollars).

Earlier on July 1 2024, Prosecution Counsel, Abba Mohammed, SAN, drew the attention of the court to the amended charge, urging the court to accept same and cause the defendant to take his plea, relying on the provi-sion of Section 216 and 217 of the Administration of Criminal Justice Act, 2015.

However, defense counsel, Adeola Adedipe, SAN objected to the plea arguing that the leave of the court must be formally sought and obtained before the EFCC can amend its charge.

Responding, the court

directed parties to furnish the court with authorities in support of the argument canvassed to which the EFCC made reference to the Court of Appeal's decision in Bovoa vFRN & Anor (2017)

During Thursday's rul-ing, the judge held that amendment was not intended to overreach the defendant and cause injustice to him and that a court may permit an alteration or amendment to a charge or framing of a new charge at any time before judgment is pronounced.

"In the court`s final decision, the arguments of the learned counsel to the defendant are hereby discountenanced and therefore hold that the application is liable to succeed accordingly, I so hold, subsequently the appli-cation is hereby granted as prayed on the face of the motion paper and the defendant is hereby ordered to take his plea on the altered or amended charge, this is the ruling of the court".

Justice Onwuegbuzie adjourned the matter to February 3, 2025 for the defendant to take his plea.

Guinness Nigeria Plc Records N20.1 Billion Pre-Tax Profit For Q2 Ending December 31, 2024

his marks a significant turnaround from the pre-tax loss of N8.2 billion in the same quarter of the previous year and is the first quarterly profit since September 2023, when the company posted a profit of N3.8 billion.

The profit boost follows Tolaram Group's takeover of operations from Diageo in June 2024. Within six months, the company recorded its first quarterly operating profit. The secondquarter profit increased halfyear pre-tax profits to about N4.1 billion, marking the first half-year profit since December 2022.

Surge in Revenue Boosts Margins: Guinness Nigeria Plc reported revenue of N259.6 billion for FY 2024, representing an impressive increase of 82.06% compared to FY 2023. Domestic sales accounted for 98.5% of total revenue, while export sales contributed the remaining 1.5%. Despite strong revenue growth, the cost of sales surged by 107.54% year-on-year, rising from N96.6 billion in the previous year to N200.5 billion in2024.

However, the company recorded a gross profit increase of 28.45% year-onFY 2023. Marketing and distribution expenses also increased significantly, rising by 33.00% to N31.6 billion from N23.7 billion in the prior year.

With rising operational expenses, operating profit declined to N11.2 billion, down from N16.3 billion reported in the previous year.

Analysts observed that the primary driver of Guinness Nigeria's profitability was a surge in topline revenue, which hit a record N133.7 billion this quarter-the highest ever recorded by the company. The revenue surge helped mitigate cost pressures,

Guinness reported an operating loss of N6.8 billion at the end of September 2024, its first quarter of the current financial year. Operating profit margins, however, rebounded to 13.2%—the highest since March 2022, when margins stood at around 18.5

Meanwhile, net finance charges, which had been a major driver of losses in recent years, swung to a net gain this quarter. Although finance expenses more than doubled to N59.5 billion in the quarter under review, this was offset by a surge in finance income totaling N63.9 billion.

This turnaround was pri-

marily driven by gains from the remeasurement of foreign currency balances, which accounted for 99.51% of the finance income The swing in profitability is seen as a significant boost for the new owners of Guinness Nigeria Plc, as they work to revitalize one of Nigeria's largest brewers.

Tolaram Group, which acquired Guinness in June 2024, has reported its first operating profit for the company in less than six months under its management. It is understood that Guinness Nigeria is likely to be delisted from the Nigerian Exchange as the new owners move forward with a mandatory takeover of the company's shares from minority shareholders.

Oando Secures Block KON 13 Operatorship In Angola

ando PLC has announced that its Energy Resources (OER), has been appointed as the operator of Block KON 13, located in Angola's Onshore Kwanza Basin.

This achievement comes on the heels of Qando's successful \$783 million acquisition of the Nigerian Agip Oil Company (NAOC) from Italian firm Eni, covering asset costs and reimbursements.

OER secured the operatorship of Block KON 13 after participating in a competitive bidding process organized by the Angolan National Agency for Petro-leum, Gas, and Biofuels (ANPG).

The block, situated in the resource-rich Kwanza Onshore Basin, boasts significant pre-salt and post-salt formations, with an esti-mated potential of 770 to 1,100 million barrels of oil. It also features two exploration wells that have already been drilled to a depth of 3,000 meters, revealing the presence of oil and gas at various levels.

As the block's operator, OER will lead development efforts, holding a 45% stake, while Effimax and Sonangol will serve as co-venturers with 30% and 15% interests, respectively. Wale Tinubu, Group Chief Executive of Oando PLC, expressed excitement about the acquisition and its significance for the company's expansion across Afriča. "This successful bid and award of Block KON 13 in Angola is a significant milestone. It reflects Oando's steadfast commitment to extending our reach across the continent and contributing to Africa's energy suffi-ciency objectives," Tinubu remarked.

Economic Policies Under Fire: Is the Nation Losing Its Way?

n recent times, Nigeria's economic policies have come under intense scrutiny, with businesses, investors, and everyday citizens questioning whether the nation is on the right track. From inflationary pressures to rising unemployment, volatile exchange rates, and regulatory uncertainty, concerns about the country's economic direction are growing louder. Many young Nigerians, disillusioned with the economic prospects at home, are seeking opportunities abroad—a trend popularly referred to as the "Japa" wave. This brain drain further weakens the country's economic potential, as skilled professionals leave in search of better opportunities.

Politically, the government faces mounting pressure to adjust its economic strategy. Opposition voices argue that the administration's policies lack a clear direction and are failing to deliver tangible benefits to the people. While authorities maintain that reforms take time to yield results, the patience of the average Nigerian is wearing thin.

For Nigeria to regain economic stability and growth, a more pragmatic approach to policy-making is required. Transparency, consistency, and stakeholder engagement must be prioritized. Rather than imposing taxes and restrictive regulations without proper consultation, the government should work closely with businesses, financial experts, and labor groups to craft policies that promote sustainable growth.

Additionally, addressing structural issues such as power supply, transportation infrastructure, and insecu-

rity will go a long way in improving the business climate. A shift from reliance on oil revenue to a more diversified economy—driven by agriculture, manufacturing, and technology—must be backed by supportive policies that encourage local production and innovation.

The current economic trajectory is unsustainable. If Nigeria continues on this path without significant policy adjustments, the consequences could be dire. The government must recognize that economic policies are not just about numbers and statistics; they have real-life implications for millions of Nigerians. A course correction is needed—one that prioritizes economic stability, encourages investment, and ensures that growth is inclusive. Otherwise, the fears of a nation losing its way may become a harsh reality.

Atiku Abubakar And El-Rufai Warn: Nigeria's Democracy At Risk

ormer Vice President Atiku Abubakar and former Kaduna State Governor Nasir El-Rufai have raised alarm over what they described as a growing threat to Nigeria's democracy.

Speaking at a recent national conference on strengthening democracy in Abuja, the leaders warned that if urgent action was not taken, the country could lose its hard-fought democracy.

Abubakar highlighted the importance of democratic values, arguing that Nigeria was at a crossroad. He criticized the growing influence of the judiciary in determining electoral outcomes, stressing that the courts, not the people, decided candidates and winners

"We really are at a crossroads in this democratic experiment. We either decide we want to be democratic or abandon it," he said.

Abubakar also expressed frustration with the National Assembly, calling for legislative reforms to empower political parties and ensure the people determine who governs them. He further accused the Federal Government of undermining oppo-sition parties through financial inducements, adding that some political party lead-ers were given N50 million each.

"I want to say it here publicly. I met with a political party leadership in the present opposition, and they told me flatly that this government gives them N50 million each.

"Where do we go from here? This means that if we are not careful, we are talking to some of you here, but you are recipients of the N50 million from the APC government.

Do we really want to fight for democracy? If we don't, we all go back to our homes. But if we do, I have been in this struggle for over 30 years, an attempt was made on my life, and I escaped. I went into exile, but I never gave up. My businesses were taken over, and I am still surviving. So, you need to make up your mind. I am not doing it for myself. For me, I have lived my life. I am doing it because of you," the former PDP presidential candidate noted.

We are hence calling for immediate rescinding of the purported declaration as vacant, the seat of the Minority Leader and member representing Talata-Mafara South State Constituency, Hon. Aliyu Ango Kagara by the Zamfara State House of Assembly under the leadership of Hon. Bilyaminu Ismail Moriki.

Police Nab 31 Suspects, Recover Items Worth N1bn In Abuja

he Police Command in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) said it has arrested 31 suspects and recovered public items worth over N1 billion in Abuja

The Commissioner of Police (CP) in charge of the FCT, Mr Olatunji Disu said this at a news conference on Friday in Abuja.

He said 16 of the suspects had been charged to court for criminal conspiracy and mischief by injury to public roads, navigable channels and electrical installation.

The CP said the offences were punishable by life imprisonment, a fine, or both, under section 332 of the Penal Code.

Disu said 115 units of manhole and drainage covers, five motorcycles, stripped parts of electrical transformers and industrial scaffoldings.

Others according to him are, bundles of armoured and insulated cables, copper wires and fibre optic cables were recovered from the suspects.

He said other items recovered were 29 industrial/solar batteries, solar panels, several stolen infrastructure materials, 75 bags

of cement, security doors, three pieces of 5kg cylinders and others.

Disu said the arrest and recovery of the items followed the launch of "Opera-tion Sweep" Joint Task Force, consisting of the police and other security agencies in the FCT.

The commissioner said the operation was a decisive enforcement, targeting vandalism, destruction and illegal sales of critical infrastructure to "pantaker" operators and other illicit buyers.

He said that the ongoing intensive enforcement operation which commenced on Jan. 16, had been on a daily basis, both day and night.

He said it had led to the raid of several major "pantaker" markets in the territory, including Dei-Dei, Kabusa, Dei-Dei Outward Lane, Zuba, Mpape, Jabi and Nyanya.

Disu said the Abuja Markets Management Limited (AMML), under the directive of the FCT Minister, had mandated all partaker market operators to report for profiling and registration.

He said the idea was part of efforts to curb the menace of vandalism in the FCT, adding that the activities of scavengers in the FCT remained banned.



INEC Submits BVAS As Edo Tribunal Probes Over-Voting

he Edo State Governorship Election Petition Tribunal has admitted Bimodal Voter Accreditation Sys-tem (BVAS) machines submitted by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) as evidence in the ongo-ing legal challenge to the September 21, 2024 gov-ernorship election.

The submission fol-Ine submission fol-lows a subpoena secured by the Peoples Demo-cratic Party (PDP) after INEC initially declined to release the machines vol-untarily. The BVAS data is expected to play a cen-tral role in the tribunal's review particularly in verreview, particularly in ver-ifying allegations of overvoting raised by the PDP.

accredited voters recorded by BVAS and the final results declared by INEC in several polling units. PDP has argued that in multiple locations, the figures announced by the electoral commission exceeded the actual num-ber of accredited voters, a claim that could have sig-nificant implications for the outcome of the petition.

he wave of projects' commissioning in Lagos State continued on Tuesday, as Governor Babajide Sanwo-Olu inaugurated four newly completed road projects in Oriade town of Amuwo Odofin.

The Governor inaugurated the reconstructed Old Ojo Road, opening a faster alternative route for commuters travelling on Lagos-Badagry.

Sanwo-Olu also commissioned the newly rehabilitated and upgraded Mumuni Adio (formerly Buba Marwa) Road, Irede Road and Navy Town Road all in Oriade axis of Amuwo Odofin.

The projects were part of the 36 road infrastructure forced Concrete Pavement completed across the three senatorial districts by the Sanwo-Olu administration.

The 7.65 kilometre-long Old Ojo Road, which extends from Irede to Maza Maza, was split into two construc-tion phases. The completed first phase, which spans 4km from Irede Road to Oluti Bus Stop, was commissioned among the four projects inaugurated.

The second phase, Sanwo-Olu pledged, would be signed off in the coming quarters.

The Governor said the 2.2 km-long Irede Road was a single carriageway before it was expanded and dualised

(CRCP). The infrastructure, Sanwo-Olu said, will serve commuters connecting Lagos-Badagry Expressway at Trade Fair Bus Stop.

The Irede Road also serves as the gateway to Irede Jetty — a vital link for water transportation to several riverine communities, including Ibasa, Ibeshe, Ilashe and Imoore.

Sanwo-Olu said: "Today, we are commissioning yet another network of roads on the ever-growing list of lifechanging public infrastructure that we have delivered to our people. Before now, one of the most critical challenges constantly experienced by

residents and road users along the Lagos-Badagry Expressway and environs, is the perennial gridlock, translating into travel inconve-nience, loss of productive time, frustration and stress.

"Inauguration of these critical infrastructure projects is a testament to the fact that we are not unmindful of the pains of the people in this area. Our primary objective has been to provide lasting transport infrastructure and a strategic traffic manage-ment solution aimed at easing traffic congestion. It is also worth pointing out that we have gone the extra mile with these four roads, ensur-ing their upgrade from tradi-tional asphalt into what is

called Continuously Reinforced Concrete Pavement."

The Governor said he was particularly elated to end the pain hitherto experienced by road users on Mumuni Adio Road, noting that the conditions of the 3.2km infrastructure deteriorated due to the heavy axle loads from articulated vehicles transporting petroleum products and goods.

The new concrete rigid pavement will offer road users a durable experience, as the newly rehabilitated carriageway would serve as a crucial artery in the Ijegun Egba area, providing vital access to several tank farms, ljegun Egba Jetty and industrial establishments.

Sanwo-Olu reiterated that his administration would not relent in its infrastructure renewal efforts, disclosing that more projects inauguration would be held in Alimosho, Eti Osa and other areas in the coming days.

he Legal Battle Over the conduct of the November 16, 2024, governorship election in Ondo State commenced on Friday as the Election Petition Tribunal held its inaugural sitting in Akure, the state capital.

NCAA imposes 3-month suspension on Max Air over Kano incident

he Federal Govern-Ment, through The Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA), has announced the suspension of operations by Max Air following recent night incident involving the airline's aircraft in Kano.

A Max Air B734 aircraft with registration marks 5N-MBD, had experienced a tyre burst on landing at Mallam Aminu Kano International Airport, Kano on Tuesday, 28th, January 2025 at about 2251 hours.

This would be the third incident in the space of three months involving a Max Air plane.

Though the 53 passengers on board were evacu-

ated unhurt, the aircraft was temporarily shut before the runway was reopened by the Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FÁAN) by 8:00 am on Wednesday.

The Nigerian Safety Investigation Bureau (NSIB) has also initiated investigation into the occurrence.

However, the regulatory authority, the NCAA, in a statement confirming the incident said it will provide the required support to the NSIB in this regard.

Director of Public Affairs and Consumer Protection, Michael Achimugu in a statement said, "It must be stated that the specific cause(s) of this incident can only be established after the NSIB has conducted its investigation.'

tive to note that the NCAA had commenced organizational risk profiles for each scheduled operator, including Max Air, which is nearing its conclusion.

"However, as a result of this incident, Max Air is suspending its domestic flight operations for a period of three months with effect from midnight, 31st January, 2025, to allow for an internal appraisal of its operations by its management."

Achimugu stated that during the 3-month period, the NČAA will conduct a thorough safety and economic auditon Max Air.

"The safety audit will entail a re-inspection of Max Air's organization, proce-dures, personnel and aircraft

He added, "It is instruc-to note that the NCAA as specified by Part 1.3.3.3(b) of the Nigeria Civil Aviation Regulations, while the economic audit will critically examine the financial health of the airline to guarantee its capability to sustain safe flight operations.

"The resumption of Max Air's domestic flight operations will be predicated on the satisfactory completion of this audit.

The NCAA is aware of the inconvenience this action may cause intending passengers of Max Air. However; the safety and well-being of passengers is paramount. Thus, the NCAA appeals for patience and understanding while it ensures the protection of passenger rights."

Tragedy In Kadunai As Prominent Zazzau Emirate Slumps, Dies At Public Event

His remains were laid to rest at Rimin Dodo on Thursday evening, in accordance with Islamic rites.

Police Arrest Wife, Associates Of Wanted Chadian Terrorist In Kano

he Kano State Police Command has arrested the wife and several associates of a suspected Chadian terrorist, Ahmad Adam Abba, who is wanted for the killing of 17 people in his home country.

The arrests were made on the eve of the National Tijjaniyya Maulud cere-mony, held at Sani Abacha Stadium in Kano last week.

Speaking to journalists in Kano on Friday, the Commissioner of Police, Salman Garba, revealed that Abba, who remains at large, had plans to establish a terrorist base in the state.

"The wanted Chadian suspected terrorist escaped out of Nigeria, and we have successfully apprehended three of his associates, including his wife, another Chadian named Jibrin Mohammed, 42 years old, and a Nigerian," Garba stated.

He disclosed that intelli-

gence-led policing had led to the discovery of Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs), which were recovered during the operation.

'Acting on one of the intelligence reports, IEDs were recovered, and discreet investigations are ongoing,' hesaid.

Garba reassured residents that security agencies were working tirelessly to preventany threats in Kano.

"Our teams are collaborating closely with other intelligence agencies and the communities to ensure that we are working hand-inhand to identify any suspicious activities and individuals who may pose a security threat to our society," he added.

The commissioner also emphasised the importance of public cooperation in intelligence gathering, urg-ing residents to report any suspicious activities to the authorities.

Pirates Drove A Lot Of Foreign Music Recording Companies Out Of Nigeria - Stella Monye

Stella Monye, known as the Samba Queen is back to the industry that gave her fame after more than two decades hiatus. Her long absence in the industry was as a result of her son's accident. She narrates her experience and how this affected her music career Enjoy this interview she had with Sam Orji

You have been outside the music industry for a long time, how are you adjusting to the new trend in the sector now?

In the first place, my long absence was due to my sons accident which became so cumbersome because we have to travel from hospital to hospital and so, I really did not have time to pursue my career for almost two decades that I focused on my son's treatment. Its not as if its over, its just that I told myself, if you dont go back to work; it will be even more difficult to pay his bills because his medical procedure is systematic and its being done in America. I just told myself, you have to go back to work and combine the two. I gave it time and I have gotten to that point where I can say okay; while its still going on, I can still work and cushion the effect of raising money for his treatment.

How has it been carrying the burden of your sons treatment for this long and where has help come from sofar?

I will answer the first question you asked on how I am adjusting back into the business after so many years.

I know its a generational shift from what we did and what these new generations are doing. Theres no competition. I am not competing with anyone because I believe that whatever I am doing now, I have just moved a bit higher. I have gone beyond singing about mundane things and my songs are inspirational songs based on experience, so I have to sing about positive things that can inspire people. Most of the things you will be hearing from me are positive and inspirational songs and it does not mean that all these while, i have not been singing inspirational songs.

Concerning my son, I have gone through a lot of emotional torture looking at him knowing that when he is in pain, I am in pain as well; knowing that this thing happened when I left him at home for national assignment. I feel guilt because if I had taken him along or had stayed with him, it would not have happened. I have even survived heart attack during this process because I also have my own underlying medical conditions. I am diabetic, I have BP and I am managing everything at the same time. Sometimes I call myselfa cat with 13 lives. Financially, its cumbersome, emotionally its stressful and physically its demanding. Now that I have to combine my job with it, I have to look forward to tougher days ahead.

You were on national assignment when this accident happened, was there at a point government, or PMAN or your colleagues came in to support financially?

I pray so because a lot of things happened when we got to America, we had already visited India and Tiglish before we ended up in America all based on recommendations. When we ended up in America, they said they have not seen this kind of thing before because all the surgeries they did have really made things worse. They have really damaged a lot of his organs and there were a lot of technical things they have to perform on him to get him to where he is now. Like I said, he doesnt still have clean bill of health, they are still doing semantic treatment in that when they do one surgery for him, we have to wait for him to heal maybe like six months before we are back on the next one.

Maybe today they are working on his bladder; next time his intestine, or kidney. We are still working and praying that soon they will give him a clean bill of health but funding has been a very difficult part.

In totally, what did the doctors say is actually the problem with your son?

What happened is that when he had the accident, it was just one major problem and this now festered to other problems. They do this surgery, theres no success, they will say his bladder is not growing, we have to expand his bladder and something happens, they will say it has kicked his kidney, each time theres always a major organ involved, until everything becomes settled and they will give him clean bill of health. to work, I will continue to pay for that experience.

I had strong band

took you on stage performances to a couple of places outside the country but you ended up in music, what happened? When did you change your mind?

It wasnt a change of mind because I was really interested in theater arts. I thought that after my study I would become a TV producer or work with a radio station. I took a lot of interest in music and dont forget that in theater, you do a lot of songs and dancing on stage. I started writing songs that I could use for my stage drama and then I wrote Oko mi ye', somebody heard the song and said, 'this one is good; you can make a record out of this. I said I could try and that was how I took my tape to the record company EMI, I dropped it there and never got back to them or asked. So, one day a message came to my fathers house that my demonstration tape was no 1 at the panel and they said I should come for my contract. I was surprised, I didnt take the whole thing serious, I went to EMI and the rest is now history. I recorded an album and it became a hit.

Why would a student write that song, Oko mi ye' (my husband please) when you are not married?

It was inspired by my mum; she endured because she wanted to be with her children. She was really that kind of African woman who told herself that she was not going anywhere even if she has to die looking after her kids because my father was polygamous in nature. My father married more women after my mother, who was the first wife and it was really a battle. So, I have to do a song because of my mum.

How did you get the name, 'Samba Queen'?

I was not the one that gave myself the Samba Queen; it was the media, when I did Arigo Samba. After Arigo Samba which is very percussionist in style and Samba means percussion, like konga that they play in Brazil. Because of the percussion background, the media named me the Samba queen, from then on I became the Samba queen.

When you travelled to the Caribbean during one of your tours, they tagged you the bombshell. What really happened?

I wouldnt know if there was anything special, all I know is that one of my greatest gifts is being able to perform well on stage, being able to interpret whatever I am doing very well on stage. I think I came around with something great from Nigeria

I had strong band behind me: Zeal Onyia was behind me, Peter King, they were playing Saxophone, Lagbaja was the bassist, Willy Bestman was the drummer, Remy Kabaka was the drummer and I was in front. I was the one representing Nigeria and because of these great musicians that were behind me everything went explosive. It was great because Mariam Makeba was on that tour, she came to represent South Africa including other artists from all over the world were there. It was the 150th anniversary of the abolition of the slave trade in diaspora. It was just something to unify all the black people and also celebrate the abolition of the slave trade. It was great, like I said; when you have these people I mentioned behind you, of course; you cannot afford to fail. The Future Of Teacher Education: Assessing The Relevance Of College Of Education

The proposed transformation of Colleges of Education (COEs) into Universities of Education by the Federal Government has generated significant discussion. While some view this move as an acknowledgement of systemic challenges within the sub-sector, others contend that the institutions have lost their relevance and should be abolished. Nevertheless, it is unclear whether this initiative will increase the attractiveness of education programs to students or simply circumvent the deeper issues affecting the sector.

The establishment of Colleges of Education (COEs) in Nigeria was a direct response to the findings of the Ashby Commission in 1958. The commission's report exposed significant deficiencies in the country's colonialera education system, particularly in teacher training. Noting that many teachers lacked proper certification and training, the commission recommended the expansion of intermediate education for teachers. Consequently, Advanced Teachers' Colleges were established, which later evolved into Colleges of Education.

They were meant to produce wellqualified teachers for elementary and junior secondary schools to replace the older Grade II Teachers. Teachers from COEs were awarded the Nigeria Certificate in Education (NCE). The four that existed then were Advanced Teachers College, Ondo; Advanced Teachers College, Zaria; Advanced Teachers College, Kano and Alvan Ikoku Advanced Teachers College. the relevance of colleges of education, citing their absence in countries like the United States. He attributed the need for this conversion to the declining interest in colleges of education among students.

The proposed conversion aims to address the waning popularity of teacher training institutions. However, it raises questions about the potential impact on Nigeria's education system. Will this move enhance the quality of education or simply mask underlying issues? Only time will tell.

Alausa noted that despite budgetary allocation to the colleges of education, some of them were having less than 1,000 students.

"Do we need these colleges of education? They don't exist in the United States of America and several other advanced countries. Let us convert them to universities of education," he said.

He noted that in this year's budget for education, N139.3 billion was earmarked for colleges of education and there are 32 federal colleges in the country.

Colleges of Education (COEs) in Nigeria are affected by poor enrollment. Observers said students are unwilling to study education courses because they find them neither attractive nor lucrative. Data from the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) shows that application into National Certificate of Education (NCE) programmes are usually the lowNotably, 30,731 candidates were admitted that year, indicating that many students without a genuine interest in education were offered admission.

The admission trends for Colleges of Education (COEs) reveal a declining interest in National Certificate of Education (NCE) programs. Between 2020 and 2023, the number of applicants and admissions consistently decreased.

In 2022, 52,627 candidates applied for COE programs, with only 35,466 securing admissions. The following year, 2023, saw a further decline, with 28,335 applications received and only 11,735 candidates admitted.

A closer examination of the admission data reveals that NCE programs accounted for a small percentage of total admissions. In 2021, NCE admissions constituted 6.22% (30,731) of the 494,088 total admissions. This percentage decreased to 2.47% (11,735) in 2023, out of 474,765 total admissions.

Furthermore, the quota allocation for NCE admissions was not met in any of the examined years. In 2021, only 6.75% (30,731) of the allocated quota of 454, 700 was filled. This underutilization persisted, with 7.56% (35,466) and 2.49% (11,735) of the quota filled in 2022 and 2023, respectively.

Despite failing to meet admission quotas, Colleges of Education (COEs) lowered cut-off marks to stimulate enrollment. However, this strategy vielded minimal results, highlighting a deeper issue. The Ministry's proposal to upgrade COEs may address some concerns, but many experts argue that the problems plaguing these institutions run far deeper, requiring more comprehensive reforms. In a bid to boost the appeal of Colleges of Education (COEs), the Federal Government granted approval to the National Commission for Colleges Education (NCCE) to introduce the Dual Mode system. This system allows colleges to run both degree and Nigeria Certificate in Education (NCE) programs simultaneously. However, this move appears contradictory, as the government is now proposing to convert these colleges into universities.

ernment's long-term plan for COEs. On one hand, introducing the Dual Mode system aims to attract more students and enhance the quality of education. On the other hand, converting COEs into universities may undermine their unique role in providing specialized training for teachers and educators.

It's worth noting that experts like Sonny Echono, executive secretary of the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND), have expressed concerns about the conversion plan, emphasizing the need for more investment in teacher education rather than dismantling existing institutions.

Executive Secretary of NCCE, Prof. Paulinus Chijioke, also note that, the development was targeted at improving access to teacher education, addressing low enrollment, and ensuring quality production of professional teachers in the country.

Chijioke also stressed the need to continue to elevate the status of the teaching profession, ensuring that it attracted the brightest and most passionate individuals.

Contributing on the issue, Deputy National President, National Parent Teacher Association of Nigeria (NAPTAN), Chief Adeolu Ogunbanjo, said, "Colleges of Education came at that time because of the need to have professional teachers. We have had so much of them. But unfortunately, they are neither here nor there. They are not graduates. NAPTAN supports the proposal to upgrade the colleges to univer-

They increased in number gradually.

However, over time, the landscape has shifted dramatically. The teaching profession, once revered, has lost its prestige. Unfortunately, many students now pursue education courses not out of passion or aspiration, but rather as a fallback option.

Nigeria's Minister of Education, Tunji Alausa, recently proposed converting all federal colleges of education into universities of education. This suggestion was made during the ministry's 2025 budget defense at the National Assembly in Abuja. Alausa questioned est.

A breakdown revealed that between 2019 and 2023, only 211,201 applications were recorded for admission into COEs, universities and polytechnics that are running education programmes, but only 198,798 were eventually admitted. A further breakdown showed that in 2019, 34,138 candidates applied for NCE programmes, but 71,188 were later admitted. Therefore, candidates without interest in education were eventually admitted.

In 2020, Colleges of Education received 80,355 applications, with 49,678 candidates securing admission, resulting in a 40% rejection rate. However, the following year saw a significant decline in interest, with only 15,746 applications received in 2021.

This raises questions about the gov-

sities.

Then with this, the teachers should be well trained so that education's quality will improve. Of what use is NCE if it is not serving its purpose again? They have probably outlived their relevance and usefulness. When they were created, a special salary was created for them. We had so many of them. Now, they cannot be classified as ND or HND. They are neither here nor there. So, they should be turned to universities so that there would be no discrimination against any programme.

"Since government wants the colleges upgraded, it should be ready for robust funding. So that we won't start producing NCE holders in universities. Government should do the needful on proper funding." 20

In Nigeria, the issues of unplanned development which stimulates urban sprawl, slum and ghetto formation have ultimately influenced property values negatively. The resultant effect of having declining property values due to unwise land uses have been


The truth is, we cannot. We must confront the uncomfortable truth that religious identity has been weaponized for political and personal gain, fueling division and


conflict. We must reject the narratives of hatred and division that seek to define us. We must instead embrace the values of empathy, understanding, and mutual respect.



12 Years Of Agony: Abdullahi Iliya's Struggle For Survival With Untreated Burn Wounds And Tragic Losses

Abdullahi Iliya is above 20 years old and has been nursing open wounds he sustained as a result of burns in his two legs. He has been battling with the wounds for 12 years without proper treatment and the condition of his legs are getting deteriorated, limiting his chances of survival. To worsen his condition, his parents both died few months after the incident, leaving him stranded without a caregiver.

In this interview with our correspondent *Samuel Luka*, Abdullahi narrates how he has been battling with life in such a serious health challenge. Excerpts :

A buja Post: Tell us your name, address and age Abdullahi: My name is Abdullahi Iliya

Abdullahi: My name is Abdullahi Iliya and I live in Wuntin Dada Community, Jos Road, Bauchistate. I am above 20 years.

Abuja Post: What happened to your legs? I can see wounds all over them.

Abdullahi: I was caught up in a fire incident which broke out in one filling station along Jos Road, Bauchi about 12 years ago. I have been battling with this wounds since then up to this day that I am talking to you and the little assistance I used to get from some people is no longer there because the treatment has taken a very long time and I lack the money to go for proper treatment. As a result of this problem I couldn't continue in school since the incident happened. My life is been wasted and my hope for better living is crippled due to this lingering health challenge.

Abuja Post: what are your parents doing about it?

Abdullahi: My parents have died. When the accident occurred, I was rushes to the hospital where I was given some first aid, I was administered a drip, we couldn't continue with the treatment in the hospital and was taken to herbalist by my caregivers because they were aggrieved that no Doctor came to check on me. So they took me away in anger. My father and mother died about a month after the incident. I was left at the mercy of neighbors who have tried their best by helping with what to eat. As it is now, Ilive alone in a very small room with nobody to look after me, even to feed or cloth is a big challenge to me. The little assistance I used to get from some people is no longer there because the treatment has been prolonged.

Abuja Post: What happened to your educational pursuit after the incident?

Abdullahi: This thing happened to me while I was still in JSS three, we were about to sit for junior WAEC but I couldn't make it because of the condition I found myself. I couldn't continue in school since the incident happened, I didn't anticipate that the wounds will continue up to date, I am afraid that my life is wasting away and hope dashed due to this lingering health challenge confronting me. My parents have died, living me with no one to take care of me. I rely on well meaning people within the community who often assist me with food, I don't have the health to go out and hustle for myself.

Abuja Post: How have you been managing the wounds?

Abdullahi : That's how I live with it, any time I amgiven money by a good Samaritan, I rush to chemist to buy some pain killers and other medicines. Of recent, there was only one person called Alassaini who used to help me with money to buy drugs but now he has a lot of burden on him.

Abuja Post: How did the fire incident occurred?

Abdullahi : One fateful day, we were doing some menial work in one filling station when someone made a mistake that caused fire incident which affected us, that was in 2013. When the incident happened, we were rushed to specialist hospital here in Bauchi and we were received at the emer-



gency section where they administered drip on me, then we had no issue with money for the treatment but my caregivers were upset that no Doctor cared to check on me, so they decided to take me to herbalist for further treatment. After the herbalist used some herbs on me, I got relieved, but the wounds failed to heal after some time. They took me to different herbalists but to no effect. I would have love that they take me back to hospital now, but honestly speaking, since my parents have died and with no relatives who are financially sound to shoulder the expenses, I have no option than to continue to suffer.

Abuja Post: How are you coping with life now?

Abdullahi : For me, life is terrible considering my present condition, I have nothing but always relying on what comes from God through good Samaritans, I know that the problem is taking me this long because of lack of adequate treatment, and I am sure that if properly treated, it will be healed and I will bounce back to good health to achieve my life dreams.

Abuja Post: Do you have any plea or appeal to make?

Abdullahi: I want to plead with the Bauchi state government or well-meaning Nigerians to help me with the resources to go back to the hospital in order to have the wound properly treated. Let me have a renewal of hope by getting sponsors of my treatment because I don't have anybody close to me that can help me out, even to get food to eat is very hard. I can be reached through this medium.

At a point, a lot of your contemporaries like Mike Okri, Alex O, Majek Fashek, Ras Kimono and others left the country, what happened that made them to leave?

One of the reasons is that the pirates were very hard on our generation. Secondly, most of the recording companies were already folding up because of the piracy issue and they were selling the companies off. It was only when the white men ere managing those companies that they did well. As soon as they started selling the companies to the black people things became a bit difficult for them to cope with the economy because the pirates were really at work that's why they were not really making much. When the white people were here they were bringing money from their country to run the business, they did not really bother about the pirates. So, everything started wobbling at that point and when the companies

started folding some of our generation left for greener pastures. That was when Kenny Ogungbe and Dayo Adeneye now came into the music scene and started changing the narratives with other younger artistes, but few of us stayed back.

The way you people sang in your days, you touched on issues happening in the society unlike what's happening now when artistes talk basically about nothing that makes no moral sense at all. Is it the change in trends or because this is what the society wants? from Buju, for me, I choose who to listen to because that's who I want to listen to

The first person that came to my mind is Tiwa Savage, I could do my stuff with her and she would give a good interpretation. She has her own style of singing which I love very much and I know that anything she handles, she does that in her own unique way. I was working on it but somewhere along the line we lost touch and my son's accident became a major distraction, I couldn't go on with it, but if the opportunity comes, I will love to do collaboration with some of them including the male.



Don't also forget that music is evolving. We still have a lot of them that are still singing positive songs like Tubaba, Psquare, Asake and a whole lot of them still sing great songs. We don't have music soldiers like Fela Anikulapo Kuti and Sunny Okosun, all these people that sang liberation songs.

The musicians of nowadays their orientation are different, the way they reason is different, and their morals standard are different. Things happening now never happened in our time, nothing like record companies, social media was not there. They practically own their own labels now and get all their money online, so they're making money because the pirates cannot go online. CD is phasing out because people don't use it anymore and nothing for pirates to lay hands on, so this generation is in a better positioned now. It's a great development and it depends on what you listen to. There's a particular song from Buju and I hear a lot of great songs You have not tried your hands on full time acting in movies

I acted at some point. I acted in Caravan of Life, which was an NTA TV series and most of the acting was at the earliest part of my career. I did some Nigerian movies with the NTA. I did Magun, not long ago, I did Agbode Meje, (Cross road), a Yoruba movie

When I went into music, I didn't have the full time to go into acting. I love acting and I know I can act. I am really considering it, to see if I can go into full time acting but I still believe my music may not give me the opportunity. I am not competing with anyone; I will play my music the way I will think it will come out well. Its Gods grace that will propel you, not the kind of song you sing. I will be in my own class not to start dragging with these genzes. If somebody invites me to an occasion I will come and perform.
